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Banking and Financial Awareness

1. Union Minister of Finance Nirmala Sitharaman has inaugurated the **Corporate Debt Market Development Fund (CDMDF)** and initiated the **muhurat** trading on Limited Purpose Clearing Corporation mechanism called **AMC Repo Clearing Limited (ARCL), in Mumbai, Maharashtra.**

Both the initiatives intend to deepen the functioning of the corporate debt markets.

Corporate Debt Market Development Fund (CDMDF): CDMDF was first mooted in the **Union Budget 2021-22.** It is **Rs. 33,000 crore** backstop facility for **Mutual Funds** to enhance secondary market liquidity in the Corporate Bond market during stressed and normal times, thereby instilling confidence amongst participants in corporate bond market. It was **approved by SEBI in March 2023.**

State Bank of India Mutual Fund will be managing the fund. CDMDF is notified as an Alternative Investment Fund (AIF) in the form of a Trust under **SEBI (AIF) Regulations.**

2. Future Generali India Life Insurance has joined hands with **JM Financial Services Limited** to elevate its insurance product offerings and extend its market presence across India.

This will enable Future Generali to reach a larger customer base of **2.20 lakh** and serves to the various needs of individuals.

3. The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has appointed **Max Life Insurance Company Ltd (Max Life)** as the **"Lead Insurer"** for the States of **Uttar Pradesh** and **Arunachal Pradesh.**

The aim is to enhance financial awareness and insurance solutions. Other Lead Insurer: Liberty General Insurance has been appointed as the **"Lead Insurer"** for Delhi by the IRDAI under State Insurance plan.

4. As per the latest **State Bank of India's (SBI) Economic Research Report (Ecowrap),** India will become the **third-largest economy** in the world by **FY28** based on **actual Gross Domestic Product (GDP)** data as on **March 2023.**

India currently ranks **5th** in the **world's largest economy,** accounting for **3.4% of global GDP.**

- As per the report, **India** will surpass both **Japan** and **Germany** in **2027** if it develops at the present current rate of growth.
- **India's GDP** is expected to grow by more than **8% in the first quarter of Financial Year 2024 (8.1 – 8.2%).**
- **India** may surpass the **6.5%** mark of overall growth in **FY24.**

5. RazorPay, a payment and banking company, has launched the **"MoneySaver Export Account"** for **Indian exporters.** With this, Indian exporters will now open a smart account in any country of their choice and receive payments locally via bank transfers on the **Razorpay platform.**

This will be **India's first smart account** to offer **50% savings** on **international bank transfers** for exporters, and help save them from high transfer costs, chargebacks and payment failures.

6. The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has launched the **'Jeevan Kiran'** plan, a new non-linked, non-participating life insurance policy that 'returns' the premiums paid by policyholders at maturity.

Key features of Jeevan Kiran:

- The policy can be **purchased by individuals** in the age group of **18-65 years.**
- The **minimum sum** assured under the policy, which comes with tenures of **10-40 years, is Rs.15 lakh.**
- The **minimum instalment** will be **Rs. 3,000** under the regular premium option and **Rs.30,000** under the single premium variant.
- The premiums for smokers and non-smokers will vary.
- The minimum age on maturity is **28 years** and maximum is **80 years.**

7. A list of Coalition Greenwich's, a division of CRISIL, Share and Quality Leaders, and Greenwich Excellence Awards 2023 has been released in which **HDFC Bank** has overtaken **State Bank of India (SBI)** as a **top ranked bank in the 3 categories of Share and Quality Leaders Award list.**

- In the list of Greenwich Share Leader 2023 (Large Corporate), HDFC Bank has overtaken SBI and topped the list of Indian Large Corporate Banking Market Penetration-Local Banks.





- **ICICI Bank has topped the Indian Large Corporate Banking Quality-Local Banks and emerged as the sole designation for Greenwich Quality Leader 2023 (Large Corporate).**
- **In the list of Greenwich Share Leader 2023 (Middle Market), HDFC Bank has again topped the list of Indian Middle Market Banking Market Penetration (Local Banks).**
- **In the list of Greenwich Quality Leader 2023 (Middle Market), HDFC Bank has shared a top spot with ICICI Bank in the category of 'Indian Middle Market Banking Quality-Local Banks.'**

8. The Government of India (GoI) and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) have signed a USD 200 million loan as additional financing for the ongoing Rajasthan Secondary Towns Development Sector Project.

- The additional financing will help improve water supply systems in at least seven towns by converting groundwater sources to surface water, replacing about 700 km of leaking water pipes, installing 1,400 km of new water supply pipelines, and providing 77,000 households with water meter connections.
- The amount will also help establish three new water treatment plants.

9. Bengaluru-based CRED, a FinTech company, has launched RuPay credit card-based Unified Payments Interface (UPI) payments for its members, in collaboration with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). The launch of credit-on-UPI will empower CRED's members to utilise their RuPay credit cards for making payments via UPI.

10. BRICS' New Development Bank (NDB) has elected Thuraiya Hamid Alhashmi, Director of the International Financial Relations and Organisations Department at the UAE Ministry of Finance, as a member of its Board of Directors and a Constituency Director.

- She has been appointed following an internal voting process during NDB's eighth annual meeting, held recently in Shanghai, China.
- She will become the first Emirati and Arab woman to assume a director's position at the New Development Bank, which was established in July 2015 by Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa (BRICS).

11. The Securities and Exchange Board of India ('SEBI') has introduced a common Online Dispute Resolution Portal ('ODR Portal') which will harness online conciliation and online arbitration for resolution of disputes arising in the Indian Securities Market.

The provisions of this circular will be implemented in Phases:

First Phase:

- To be completed on or before **1st August 2023** which includes **Development of Portal/Empanelment of ODR Institutions** by the **Market Infrastructure Institutions ('MIIs')/Empanelment of Conciliators and Arbitrators** by such ODR Institutions.
- **Registration of Trading Members and Depository Participants** on the ODR Portal by **15th August 2023.**
- Commencement of registering of complaints/disputes against brokers and depository participants and their resolution on and from 16th August 2023.

Second Phase:

- **Registration of all other Market Participants** on the **ODR Portal by 15th September 2023.**
- Commencement of registering of complaints/disputes against all other **Market Participants** and their resolution on and from **16th September 2023.**
- **Implementation of related processes and requirements envisaged** in this Circular will be in effect by **16th September 2023.**

12. Paytm, owned by One97 Communications Ltd (OCL), has launched two new cutting-edge payment devices, the Paytm Pocket Sandbox and Paytm Music Sandbox. Both devices are equipped with 4G capabilities, providing enhanced convenience for on-the-go merchants. This is India's first Pocket & Music Sandbox.

13. India's services activity has increased to 62.3 in July 2023 from a Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) of 58.5 in June 2023. This is according to statistics issued by S&P Global in August 2023. This is the highest index reading since June 2010.

- About **29% of survey participants** reported higher intakes of new business.
- **India's service sector** is one of the fastest growing in the world. It contributes more than **50% in India's GDP.**





- **Manufacturing PMI** has declined slightly from **57.8 in June 2023 to 57.7 in July 2023.**
- **Manufacturing** has a share of around **18% in GVA.**

14. The Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) has joined hands with the **Center for Innovation Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE.CO), IIM Ahmedabad's (IIM-A)** startup incubator and investor, to establish the **SIDBI Accelerator Fund at IIMA's CIIE.CO** with a total corpus of **Rs.40 crore.**

The aim is to extend seed investment to early-stage enterprises. The development is part of **SIDBI's "India of Tomorrow"** initiative which intends to strengthen India's developmental and funding ecosystem for early-stage startups. The corpus will be equally contributed by the two entities.

15. Axis Bank, India's third-largest private sector bank, in collaboration with **National Payment Corporation of India (NPCI),** has tied up with **Kiwi, a FinTech platform,** to bolster **'Credit on UPI'** accessibility on **RuPay credit cards.**

This enables Kiwi users to seamlessly access the RuPay lifetime free virtual Axis Bank KWIK credit card through the app.

16. The State Bank of India (SBI) has raised **Rs.10,000 crore** at a coupon rate of **7.54 percent** through its **third infrastructure bond issuance.** The proceeds of bonds will be utilised in enhancing long-term resources for funding infrastructure and the affordable housing segment. The tenor of these bonds is **15 years.**

This is the **first issuance** of a long-term bond by any bank for this tenor in the current financial year. The coupon rate of the bond issuance represents a spread of 13 basis points over the corresponding FBIL G-Sec par curve.

17. Mastercard has introduced the **Cardholder Verification Code (CVC)-less online transactions** for Indian debit and credit cardholders. The aim is to reduce the checkout time and make CVC-free payment to enhance the payment security. Note: CVC is the 3-digit number (in case of Visa, Mastercard, and Discover) printed on the back of debit and credit cards.

18. The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) has sanctioned a total amount of **Rs.1,974.07 crore** to the **Rajasthan**

government under the **Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF)** for the financial year 2023-24.

Out of Rs.1,974.07 crore:

- **Rs.930.44 crore** has been sanctioned for three rural drinking water supply projects in **Ajmer, Jalore, and Kota districts.**
- **Rs.926.48 crore** was sanctioned for the construction of **676 rural roads** in the desert and tribal areas of the state.
- **Rs.117.15 crore** has been sanctioned for the **construction of 104 veterinary hospitals** and **431 sub-centres** in all **districts** of the **state.**

19. The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) Mutual Fund has completed the takeover of schemes of **IDBI Mutual Fund** from **IDBI Asset Management Limited** following the approval of **Competition Commission of India (CCI) in March 2023.**

With the completion of the merger, out of **20 schemes** of **IDBI MF, 10** will be merged with similar schemes of **LIC MF** and the remaining **10** will be taken over by **LIC MF** on standalone basis, which will take its total scheme count to **38.** The merger aims to offer schemes in the mid-cap, small-cap, gold-fund, and passive fund segments.

20. Karnataka Bank has hosted the first edition of **'KBL - FinOne',** a fintech partnership event, in Bengaluru with the objective of forging collaborations to develop innovative business models, providing seamless banking experience and offering a complete product suite.

21. IndiaFirst Life Insurance Company has launched a **non-linked and non-participating** product named **"Guarantee of Life Dreams (G.O.L.D.)"** that offers policy holders regular long-term income.

- The premium paying terms range between **6, 8, and 10 years** for policy terms of **30 years and 40 years.**
- The starting **premium** is as **low as Rs.4,176 per month** and offers the choice to pay annually or in instalments.
- The plan offers three income options: immediate, intermediate and deferred.

22. IndusInd Bank has tied up with **Tiger FinTech Private Limited, a Bajaj Capital Group company,** to **launch the IndusInd Bank Tiger Credit Card,** a co-branded credit card powered by Visa. The card offers





a '**Magnificent Rewards Program**', where customers earn up-to 6X accelerated rewards. The cardholders will also be able to convert their rewards points to air miles and enjoy discounted foreign currency mark-up of 1.5% on international spends.

23. The **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** and **Association of Portfolio Managers in India (APMI)** will jointly set standards for performance audit of **Portfolio Management Services (PMS) players**. • **PMS players** are required to conduct a performance audit annually and submit a report within **60 days** after the end of a financial year.

- This performance audit needs to consider all clients' portfolios managed by the PMS.
- However, performance of advisory clients can be excluded only if it is not published in any marketing material or website.
- The standard specified by **APMI** will be **effective from 1st October 2023**.

23. **US-based payments major PayPal** has announced the launch of a **U.S. dollar-denominated stablecoin** named "**PayPal USD**" (**PYUSD**) which is backed by dollar deposits, **US treasuries**, and **cash equivalents**. It will be issued by **Paxos Trust Co to PayPal customers in the United States**.

Stablecoin: It is a type of cryptocurrency that is designed to have a stable value, typically pegged to a stable asset or reserve, such as a fiat currency like the US dollar or a commodity like gold.

24. **Bajaj Finance** has partnered with **ICICI Lombard General Insurance** along with other partners to provide car and two-wheeler insurance plans on the platform **Bajaj Finance Insurance Mall**. The **ICICI Lombard Car and Two-wheeler Insurance** policies offer comprehensive damage coverage, including third-party cover, personal accident cover, No Claim Bonus (NCB), and various add-on benefits to vehicle owners.

25. **Star Health and Allied Insurance (Star Health)** has entered into a bancassurance tie-up with UK-based **Standard Chartered Bank (SCB)** to enhance the accessibility of health insurance products through the bank's extensive distribution network. Under this tie-up, **SCB** will offer **Star Health's** insurance products through their extensive branch network across India. **SCB** currently has 100 branches spread across 42 cities. Bancassurance is an insurance

distribution model where insurance companies partner with banks to sell policies.

26 Insurance Company Limited (RGICL) has signed a contract with the **Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Meghalaya** for the implementation of the **Megha Health Insurance Scheme (MHIS)** and the **Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) Phase 6 in Meghalaya**.

RGICL emerged as the successful bidder to implement a revised **MHIS 6** scheme in convergence with **PMJAY**, providing an insurance cover of **Rs.5,30,000** for all eligible beneficiaries on a family floater basis.

27. Postal Life Insurance (PLI) has introduced a pilot program for "**Direct Incentive Disbursement**" in **Delhi** and **Uttarakhand** circles to recognize the pivotal role of its sales force.

This **Direct Incentive Disbursement** initiative is their agent incentive program under which agents' commissions from the previous month directly transferred to their **Post Office Savings Bank (POSB)** Accounts resulting in swift and secure transactions.

28. Bandhan Bank has tied up with the **Odisha Government** to help them strengthen payment solutions for **Odisha Tourism Development Corporation (OTDC) Ltd**. The lender has provided **Point of Sale (PoS)** machines to facilitate card payments by tourists.

29. Sashidhar Jagdishan, the MD & CEO of HDFC Bank, has become the highest-paid bank **Chief Executive Officer (CEO)** in **FY23** with **Rs.10.55 crore** pay.

Among the bank CEOs, **Axis Bank's Amitabh Chaudhry's** received a payout of **Rs.9.75 crore** in **FY23** making it the second highest in terms of overall pay, followed by **Sandeep Bakhshi of ICICI Bank**, who received a **payout of Rs.9.60 crore** for the fiscal year. **Kaizad Bharucha, the deputy managing director of HDFC Bank**, drew **Rs.10 crore** for **FY23** and is likely to be the second-highest grossing banker in India.

30. PayU India has partnered with **CSC Academy, a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) of the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY)**, to provide digital and financial literacy to the weak and underprivileged segments of society.





Under this, mobile vans will be stationed in and around three districts in **Delhi/Gurugram, Mumbai, and Bengaluru** for people between **the ages of 15 and 60** to provide financial and digital literacy instructions as well as other civic services. The program runs from **1st July 2023 to 30th June 2024**. **The Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs) from CSC will play a pivotal role in administering this campaign.**

31. The Export-Import Bank of India (Exim Bank) has launched its subsidiary **"India Exim Finserve IFSC Private Limited (Exim Finserve)"** at the **GIFT City in Gandhinagar, Gujarat**.

The new entity will initially begin providing factoring services to Indian exporters. Factoring service involves a business selling its accounts receivable (invoices) to a third party to meet its short-term liquidity needs. **EXIM Finserve** is the **first finance** company in **GIFT City** for export financing.

The subsidiary aims to empower exporters with a trio of services:

- Receivables financing
- Risk mitigation against non-payment
- Efficient accounts receivable management

Note: The **first** announcement to **establish** a **subsidiary** of **EXIM Bank** for trade refinancing in **GIFT City** was made in the **Union Budget 2023**.

32. AU Small Finance Bank (AU SFB) has become **the first bank in India** to provide **24x7 for 365 days video** banking facility to all the customers (including account holders under **Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) for free of cost**.

This service provides a virtual platform where customers can communicate with a video banker in real time via video calls, like video conferencing.

33. The 12 public sector banks (PSBs) in India have recorded a cumulative net profit of **Rs.34,774 crore** in the first quarter of the **financial year 2023-24**. In **Q1** of **FY23**, **all 12 state** owned banks had recorded a total **profit of Rs.15,306 crore**.

Most banks has recorded net interest margin (NIM) of over 3 percent. Pune-based Bank of **Maharashtra** has recorded the **highest NIM of 3.86** percent, followed by **Central Bank at 3.62 percent** and **Indian Bank at 3.61 percent** during the quarter. During the **first quarter**, four lenders logged a profit of over 100 percent. The highest percentage growth has been recorded by **Punjab National Bank**, which earned a profit of **Rs 1,255 crore against Rs 308 crore** in the

same quarter of the previous year, a growth of 307 percent. It is followed by the **State Bank of India (SBI)**, which recorded a **178 percent bottom line growth** at **Rs 16,884 crore** and the **Bank of India** with a **176 percent surge**, earned **Rs 1,551 crore profit**.

34. Airtel Payments Bank has become the **first Indian Bank** to launch eco-friendly debit card for its new and existing customers with a savings bank account.

The debit cards will be crafted from re-cycle-Poly Vinyl Chloride (r-PVC) material, a certified eco-friendly material, against normal PVC cards. Every batch of 50,000 cards produced would reduce carbon emissions by 350 kilograms. The card comes in two variants (under Classic variant): Personalised Classic card & Insta Classic card.

35. Altigreen, India's top commercial electric vehicle maker, has collaborated with Axis Bank to provide customized retail financing alternatives to its customers. This will streamline and simplify the purchasing process and empower customers in their transition to electric mobility.

36. Swiss impact investor response **Ability Investments AG** signed a **USD 15 million** funding deal with non-bank lender **Electronica Finance** to promote green financing in India in line with its sustainability goal.

Electronica Finance will use the funding for financing energy-efficient machines and promoting rooftop solar installation.

37. Paytm Founder Vijay Shekhar Sharma has entered into an agreement to **acquire 10.3 percent stake in Paytm from Antfin (Netherlands) Holding B.V**. This acquisition will be done via his **100 percent** owned overseas entity, **Resilient Asset Management B.V. (Netherlands)** and through an off-market transfer. On the closing of this transaction, **Vijay Shekhar Sharma's** shareholding in **Paytm (direct and indirect)** will increase to **19.42%**, while **Antfin's** shareholding will **reduce to 13.5%**.

38. Kotak Mahindra Life Insurance Company (Kotak Life) has entered into a corporate agency tie-up with **ESAF Small Finance Bank (ESAF Bank)** to offer life insurance to customers.





This tie-up plans to benefit **68 lakh customers of ESAF Bank** that will offer a wide range of tailor-made life insurance products and solutions provided by **Kotak Life**.

39. **Axis Bank** has announced that it will raise its stake in **Max Life Insurance to 16.2% from 9.99%** by infusing **Rs.16.12 billion (\$194.6 million)** through a preferential allotment of shares. This capital infusion will help **Max Life** to support its growth ambitions, augment capital position and improve solvency margins.

40. The **Indian Banks' Association (IBA)** has constituted the **Sectoral Committee** to address the unique regulatory landscape and challenges faced by **26 member banks** operating within the **Gujarat International Finance Tec-City (GIFT City)** in **Gandhinagar, Gujarat**. The committee will act as a bridge between the banking industry and regulators.

41. **Climate tech startup Chakr Innovation** has raised **Rs.18 crore (USD 2.2 million) funding** from the **Export-Import Bank of India (EXIM Bank)**. The funds are sanctioned under **EXIM Bank's Ubharte Sitare Programme (USP)**, for developing the environmental sustainability and technology sector in India.

42. The **Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA)** in coordination with the **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** has introduced the option for **National Pension System (NPS)** subscribers to view their pension fund corpus alongside their demat securities and mutual fund holdings using a single **Consolidated Account Statement (CAS)**. Currently, CAS, which is provided by National Securities Depository Ltd and Central Depository Services Ltd, offers a consolidated view of personal investments in the securities market with updated mark-to-market values.

43. The **National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)** has launched the 3rd edition of the **UPI Safety Awareness Campaign** named "**UPI Chalega.**" The campaign aims to promote UPI as an easy, safe, and instant mode of payment.

It also educates users about various features such as **UPI LITE**, which enables swift low-value transactions; **UPI AUTOPAY**, which allows secure and convenient recurring payments using any UPI application; and **UPI Interoperability**, which facilitates seamless

money transfers between all UPI-enabled applications.

The **UPI Chalega campaign** was first launched in **2020** under the guidance of the **Financial Literacy Advisory Committee (FLAC)**.

44. **Broking firm Zerodha** has received final approval from the **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** to launch an **Asset Management Company (AMC)- Zerodha Asset Management Private Limited** called as "**Zerodha Fund House.**"

- **Zerodha Fund House** is the joint venture (JV) of **Zerodha** with **Smallcase Technologies Private Limited (smallcase)**, a fintech platform.
- **Vishal Jain** has been appointed as the **Chief Executive Officer (CEO)** of **Zerodha Fund House**.
- In August 2023, **Singapore-based Helios Capital Management**, which offers **Portfolio Management Services (PMS)** has also been granted approval from **SEBI** to launch a **Mutual Fund Business**.

45. The **Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI)** has approved the appointment of **Amit Jhingran** as the **new Managing Director (MD) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO)** for **SBI Life Insurance Company Limited**.

He will succeed **Mahesh Kumar Sharma**, the incumbent **MD & CEO** of **SBI Life**.

46. **PayNearby**, a fintech platform owned by **Nearby Technologies Private Limited**, has joined hands with **Protean eGov Technologies (Protean)** to provide credit services on the **Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) network** for last-mile borrowers and **Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs)**.

Protean will aggregate **Loan Service Providers (LSPs)** onto a **single platform**.

Under this association, Protean will be an **ONDC technology service provider** through **PayNearby's Distribution as a Service (DaaS)** network through over **12 lakhs active PayNearby outlets**.

47. The **Multi Commodity Exchange of India Limited (MCX)**, the country's largest commodity exchange, has selected **Lex Carta Pvt** as the **primary Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) service provider**.





A complaint/dispute initiated through the ODR portal will be referred to an ODR Institution empaneled by a Market Infrastructure Institution.

The ODR will provide an efficient mechanism for dispute resolution between investors/clients and all the stakeholders in the securities market.

48. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has approved a **USD 40.5 million** loan for **integrated Early Childhood Development (ECD)** and **Maternal Mental Health in Meghalaya**. The Government of **Meghalaya** is **contributing USD 15.27 million** to the project.

The project will strengthen home-based childcare (**children 0-1.5 years**) and center-based childcare (**1.5-6 years**) through daycare (**Anganwadi**) centers in **Meghalaya**.

India's overall unemployment rate falls to 7.95% in July from 8.45% in June

- According to data released by private forecaster **Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy**, the total unemployment rate fell to **7.95% in July, from 8.45% in June**
- Rural unemployment rate fell to **7.89%, from 8.73% in June**, while the urban unemployment rate ticked up, **to 8.06% from 7.87% in the same period.**
- Rural unemployment rate falls due to increased demand for laborers for farming work.
- Labour force rate in urban areas also fell, indicating a broader weakness in the economy.

President of India inaugurated 'UNMESH' and 'UTKARSH' festivals in Bhopal.

- **President Draupadi Murmu** will inaugurate the national festival of India's folk and tribal expressions "Utkarsh" and the international literature festival "Unmesh" in Bhopal.

- Culture Department Madhya Pradesh along with **Sangeet Natak Akademi and Sahitya Akademi** of the Ministry of Culture is organizing this event from **3rd to 5th August.**
- The international literature festival Unmesh is Asia's largest literary convention
- 15 countries will participate in the Unmesh festival.

NHAI Launched 'Rajmargyatra' Unified Mobile App for National Highway Users

- The **National Highways Authority of India (NHAI)** has launched the 'Rajmargyatra,' a citizen-centric unified mobile application.
- **Aim:** To create a seamless, user-friendly experience for highway users.
- The user-centric app marks a substantial advancement in providing travelers with comprehensive information about Indian National Highways.
- It provides **real-time weather updates, timely broadcast notifications and details about nearby toll plazas, petrol stations and hospitals.**

Health Ministry prohibits sale of Ketoprofen and Aceclofenac

- According to a notification issued by the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, **the production, sale, and distribution of 'ketoprofen' and 'aceclofenac',** along with their formulations, for animal use are prohibited under section 26A of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940.
- The recommendation for this ban was made by **the Drugs Technical Advisory Board (DTAB).**
- DTAB is the apex authority for making statutory decisions on technical drug-related matters in India.

RVNL, Russian partner to build 120 Vande Bharat trains

- A joint venture between public sector company **Rail Vikas Nigam Ltd (RVNL)** and Russian company **Metrowagonmash** is on course to manufacture and supply around **120 Vande Bharat trains** to Indian Railways, at a cost of ₹120 crore per train.





- The RVNL wants a larger share of 69%, leaving 26% for Metrowagonmash and 5% for a third partner, Locomotive Electronic Systems.
- Blue-and-white trains, with AC, are expected to be manufactured at a railway factory in Maharashtra.

Anti-dumping duty on optical fibre imports from China, Korea, and Indonesia

- The Finance Ministry has imposed a definitive anti-dumping duty on certain optical fibre imports from China, South Korea and Indonesia.
- Aim: To give some relief to the domestic optical fibre industry reeling under the adverse impact of low-price and low-quality imports.
- The anti-dumping duty ranges from \$122 per kfkkm to \$857.23 per kfkkm, with the commodity being traded in fkm (fibre kilometres).
- Optical fibres are used to transmit data in the form of light pulses.

India hands over 450 million for Sri Lanka Unique Digital Identity project

- India has handed over INR 450 million in advance to Sri Lanka to fund its unique digital identity project in Aug 2023.
- It is the most crucial step in the island nation's digitalization program being implemented through the Indian grant assistance.
- Aims: To collect biographic and biometric information which will be stored in a centralised system to issue identification cards as per the standards set by the International Civil Aviation Organisation)

Nirmala Sitharaman laid foundation stone for Adichanallur museum

- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman laid the foundation stone for an archeological museum at Adichanallur in Tamil Nadu in August 2023.
- Objective: To focus on establishing the significance of the archaeological sites identified as part of the cultural landscape of the Thamirabarani valley, not limiting to the site of Adichanallur.
- Adichanallur was one of the five archaeological sites declared to be developed as 'Iconic Sites' in the Union Budget 2020-21.

Meri Mati Mera Desh" campaign launched to pay tribute to the 'Veers'

- The nationwide campaign "Meri Mati Mera Desh" Campaign has been launched to pay tribute to the 'Veers' who laid down their lives for the country.
- AIM: It will include programs at the village, and block levels, by local urban bodies, as well as state and national level.
- During the campaign of "Meri Mati Mera Desh", an Amrit Kalash Yatra will also be taken out.
- It will start on 9th August, with scheduled programs until Independence Day 2023.

World Trade Organization ranks India 18th in merchandise exports 2022

- According to the World Trade Statistical Review 2023, the annual flagship publication of the World Trade Organization (WTO), India is ranked 18th among the Leading exporters in world merchandise trade (2022).
- On a global scale, India holds the 9th spot in merchandise importing and ranks 7th in merchandise exporting (2022).
- The leading exporters in world merchandise trade for the year 2022 are China, the USA, and Germany, occupying the top three positions.

Centre approves establishment of new spaceport in Kulasekarapattinam

- Minister of State Science & Technology Jitendra Singh has approved the establishment of a new spaceport in Kulasekarapattinam, Tamil Nadu in August 2023.
- Aims: To carrying out the launches of the Small Satellite Launch Vehicles developed by ISRO.
- The Indian Space Policy 2023 has the provision for utilisation of a spaceport for carrying out launch activities by Non-Government Entities, subject to technical feasibility and range safety constraints.

India committed to eliminating Lymphatic filariasis by 2027

- **The National Company Law Tribunal approved the merger scheme of India's homegrown entertainment company Zee Entertainment Enterprises with Culver Max Entertainment in Aug 2023.**
- **Aim:** To create a \$10-billion Indian media giant.
- ZEE will have 30 days to file with the registrar of companies, following which, the shares of the company will be de-listed from the stock exchanges and the merged company will get re-listed in another six weeks.

IEPFA and Common Service Centre (CSC) launches "Niveshak Sarathi" Vans

- **Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (IEPFA) CEO Anita Shah Akella and Common Service Centre (CSC) launched two Investor Awareness Vans titled "Niveshak Sarathi"**
- **Theme:** From Unawareness to Financial Independence.
- **Aims:** To disseminate crucial financial education and raise awareness against fraudulent schemes across the Delhi NCR region.

- These vans are equipped with a TV screen running "Hisab Ki Kitab," developed by IEPFA.

Narendra Modi lays foundation of Sant Ravidas temple in Madhya Pradesh

- **PM Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for a temple-cum-memorial for Sant Ravidas and along with that also inaugurated developmental works which are worth Rs 4,000 crore in Madhya Pradesh in Aug 2023**

About IVF

- It's one of the more widely known types of ART IVF works by using a combination of medicines and surgical procedures to help sperm fertilize an egg and help the fertilized egg implant in your uterus.

1st crude oil transaction in local currency undertaken between India-UAE

- **The first-ever crude oil transaction under the newly implemented Local Currency Settlement (LCS) system took place between Abu Dhabi National Oil Company and Indian Oil Corporation Limited.**
- Both Indian Rupees and UAE Dirhams were used for the transaction,
- India and UAE have a strong oil and gas relationship and the UAE is a key partner for India's energy security.

- UAE is the fourth largest source of crude oil and the second largest source of LNG and LPG for India.

Chennai-based Agnikul Cosmos begins integration of its first satellite

- **Chennai-based space tech startup Agnikul Cosmos has launched its first small satellite rocket, named Agnibaan SOrTeD, with its private launchpad at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.**
- The rocket is driven by Agnikul's patented Agnilet engine, which is a 3D-printed, single-piece, 6 kN semi-cryogenic engine.
- These flight events have been configured to validate key technologies integral to the success of the company's upcoming orbital flights.

- National Tiger Conservation Authority approved **India's 54th tiger reserve in Rajasthan's** Karauli and Dholpur districts
- This is **Rajasthan's fifth tiger reserve** after Ranthambore, Sariska, Mukundra Hills, and Ramgarh Vishdhari.

IAF to hold multi-national exercise 'Tarang Shakti' with world's top air

Screaming is a unique noise. Research suggests when we scream in fear, the noise serves the dual purpose of sharpening our own focus in the face of a threat as well as of warning others. In fact, our brains process screams in a unique way. Most noises we hear are delivered from our ear to an area of the brain devoted to analyzing a sound and breaking it into its component parts, such as gender, age, and tone; high or low; a brass, stringed or electric instrument — or several combined; a ribbit or a coo, and what animal makes that sound. This **indicates** that we differentiate all the noises we hear everyday, even subconsciously.

A scream is different though, according to David People, PhD, a professor of psychology and neural science at New York University. People is the lead author of a 2015 study that looked into what happens in the body when people scream in fear. A scream goes straight from the ear to the amygdala, the part of the brain that processes fear and kickstarts the body's fight-or-flight response. The sound jolts our brains into increased alertness and analysis. This is especially true for screams when we're scared. These have a unique sound signature encompassed by the term "roughness." This roughness is what serves to alert others to danger. Humans and other animals scream for many reasons — in joy, in surprise, in fear. But we've evolved to be able to produce different shrieks and to be able to discern the difference when we hear them. (Incidentally, roughness is also why we find the sound of a baby crying and fingernails on chalkboards disturbing; both sounds have high roughness.) If we **focus on** the sounds that gain our attention, we will be able to tell which one is rough and which is not. But

what about people who have the opposite reaction when they're scared? What about the people who don't scream in fear, but become speechless in the face of a threat? This has been less studied, but it's likely a part of the third, overlooked response to terror: paralysis. Contrary to pop medicine, fight and flight aren't the only two reactions to something scary. Humans, like other animals, also evolved the option to freeze, or "play dead" in the face of a threat. This happens involuntarily, when the cerebellum, the part of the brain that regulates muscle activity, overpowers other terrified brain responses and basically shuts down all movement. Since screaming takes quite a few muscles (probably a little less than the 100 used for speaking), a person frozen in fear is rendered mute as well as immobile.



Screen time refers to the amount of time spent and the diverse activities performed online using digital devices. For instance, screen time encompasses both, using digital devices for work purposes as well as for leisure and entertainment. The COVID-19 pandemic came with restrictions, regulations and stay-at-home orders. Many





individuals could not return to their homes, many stuck in foreign lands and many in solitude. As a result, the usage of digital devices has increased manifold across the globe. The addiction to the digital devices has started to **run** in the genes of individuals. Irrespective of age, people are pushed to rely on digital platforms. Education, shopping, working, meeting, entertaining and socializing suddenly leaped from offline to online. 
